## YOUNG FALCONS EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAM PREPARES FOR TAKE-OFF

Dear Young Falcon Families,

Freeman Public Schools will be offering site-based Pre-School in the fall of 2010 to three and four year-old children of our district. With this mailing you will find a Young Falcons Application, if you have interest in the Young Falcon program please fill out the application and return it to the district office. Space in the Pre-School is limited, so your prompt reply is very important. As you consider the Young Falcon program allow me to share some of the specifics to aid you in your decision making process:

- The program will run Monday through Thursday from 8:15 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.
- The program begins the week of August 16<sup>th</sup> and ends the week of May 9<sup>th</sup>
- The program is free to any 3 or 4 year old who qualifies for Special Education Services
- Program cost to patrons is \$50 a month for children who do not qualify for Special Education Services
- The program will provide an endorsed Early Childhood Specialist, Speech Language Pathologist, and consult and on-site services from other appropriate service providers.
- Breakfast will be served within the program. Cost for breakfast is the responsibility of participating families, but Free and Reduced Meal Forms are available.
- Limited transportation will be made available where appropriate

- Registration Forms and Check-lists will be made available after confirmed acceptance

Freeman Public Schools is excited to offer this critical service to our children and patrons as your district believes that a positive beginning leads to future success. Thank you in advance for your consideration of the Young Falcon Program for your three or four year-old child. Please direct any questions regarding this program to my office at, 988-2525.

### BREAKFAST IS SERVED

Freeman Public Schools will be offering a Breakfast Program beginning in the fall of 2010. Breakfast will be available beginning August 16<sup>th</sup> through the end of the school year. Kindergarten through 6<sup>th</sup> Grade students can come for breakfast beginning at 7:50 a.m. Seventh through 12<sup>th</sup> Grade students will have the option for breakfast between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> periods.

Families' applications for Free and Reduced Priced meals do apply for the breakfast program. The cost of the breakfast has not yet been set by the Board of Education but should be in the \$1 to \$1.35 range. Look for a menu regarding breakfast items toward the end of summer break. 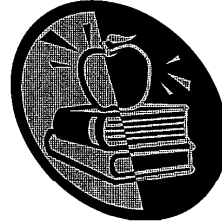

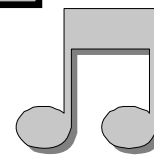

### **TRACK MEET**

Morgan Lenner, a freshman, was the lone competitor for Freeman at the State Track Meet, but she represented the school proudly. Morgan's first event was the 800 meter run. She ran a 2:25.0, which tied her personal best time and put her in fifth place. When Morgan finished, she told her coach, Ms. Renken, "I had a lot left, I can go faster!" Morgan is truly a competitor.

When it came time for the mile run, Morgan knew she was going to have to use a lot of patience. When you get to the State Meet, you have 24 girls who are all used to running out front and many of them start out too fast trying to get to the lead. Morgan ran a really smart race. At the half-mile mark, she was about ninth place and she knew it was time to start making her move. Morgan finished the 1600 meter run in a time of 5:31.816, which earned her fifth place at the State Meet, was a personal record, and set the school record. The previous school record was set by Elyse Schlake in 2003 at 5:39.0. Morgan took ten seconds off her best time on a hot and windy day, which were not ideal running conditions.

A big thank-you goes out to all of the fans who came up to Omaha Saturday to support Morgan as she represented Freeman at the State Meet. It was great to see you all there. This was a great way to end our season.

### MINUTES OF MAY 10, 2010 BOARD MEETING

Meeting called to order at 7:38 p.m. Board members Meints, Ideus, Dorn, Parde, and Remmers were present for roll call. Superintendent Page was also present. Motion by Ideus and second by Meints to excuse Board member Finkner's absence due to the honor's program. Dr. Michl was not in attendance for roll call due to the honor's program as well. Vote For: Dorn, Parde, Remmers, Meints, and Ideus. Vote Against: None. Motion Carried. The agenda was approved and the location of the Open Meetings Act was noted as per Nebraska statute 84-1412.

Consent Agenda: Motion made by Meints and seconded by Remmers to approve the consent agenda which includes approving the minutes of previous meeting, General Fund bills of \$70,526.90, Lunch Fund bills of \$7,687.93, payroll expenditures of \$245,526.23, and financial reports. Vote For: Dorn, Parde, Remmers, Meints, and Ideus. Vote Against: None. Motion Carried.

Reports and Discussion: Superintendent Page Reports/Discussion: Passed on to the board that staff had expressed appreciation for the lunch and dessert the board provided in recognition of them last week; conducted a walk-thru and identified areas that would benefit by additional security cameras proposed and looked at the tile condition in the main walkway of the commons; reported that there were grant dollars available from ESU #5 for character education banners for the entrance at no cost to the district; that the classified evaluation process is nearly complete. One issue identified by staff was a desire to have their paid leave package more in-line with the certified package; informed the board that the HVAC preventative maintenance contract has been entered into for a two-year term, that Kindergarten Round-Up identified 32 students as planning to enroll in kindergarten, and that Rodger Pella recommends hiring a student for 150-200 hours to assist with summer projects. Principal Michl's report and discussion moved to later in the meeting.

Facilities: Board member Meints explained the football field diagrams resulting from the Olsson survey and suggested that Option 2, on the old field was the preferred option and the committee would like to present it to the Village for their approval; Board member Meints agreed that the tile needs to be replaced but with the need for a new lawnmower it was suggested that it may be a preferable option to replace only the tile in the high traffic walkway area for now, rather than the entire commons and hall as was bid.

Negotiations: Board member Ideus reported that Superintendent Page had provided the negotiations committee with suggested tiers for classified staff pay. The tiers establish starting level pay and suggested moving points. There has been some discussion about moving to PTO (paid time off) days versus sick, personal, and bereavement days for classified staff. Board Member Finkner arrived at 8:35pm and Principal Michl arrived at 8:38pm.

Transportation: Superintendent Page reported that the district went through a difficult stretch where we were down to six busses; but that all eight busses are functioning at this time. The committee needs to establish a date soon to go over the bus situation and inspections with Melvin. President Parde reported that the committee requested used vehicle proposals from Carriage Motors, Brinkman's and Ray's. The committee will continue looking into vehicles of interest.

Principal Michl reported that seniors had been offered over ½ million dollars in scholarships this year and that staff had signed up to attend several workshops over the summer.

Action Items: Motion by Dorn and second by Ideus to continue in the Southeast Nebraska Power School Cooperative through August of 2012. Vote For: Parde, Finkner, Remmers, Meints, Ideus and Dorn. Vote Against: None. Motion Carried.

Motion by Remmers and second by Meints to accept ADT's proposal for \$2264.05 to enhance the security within Freeman Schools and network all video streaming. Vote For: Finkner, Remmers, Meints, Ideus, Dorn, and Parde. Vote Against: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Meints and second by Remmers to move forward with the parking lot repairs by Pavers for \$3606.50. Vote For: Ideus, Dorn, Parde, Finkner, Remmers, and Meints. Vote Against: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Finkner and second by Ideus to accept a letter of resignation from Lia Heckenlively, 7-12 Science. Vote For: Dorn, Parde, Finkner, Remmers, Meints, and Ideus. Vote Against: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Meints and second by Parde to offer a contract for 1 FTE for a 7-12 Science Teacher for the 2010/11 School Year to Emily Garrison. Vote For: Finkner, Remmers, Meints, Ideus, Dorn, and Parde. Vote Against: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Remmers and second by Finkner to offer a contract for .5 FTE for an Early Childhood Special Ed Pre-School Teacher for the 2010/11 School Year to Jenifer Stepan-Alberts. Vote For: Meints, Ideus, Dorn, Parde, Finkner, and Remmers. Vote Against: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Meints and second by Dorn to approve future alterations to the current Football Field at the Adams Park (Olsson's Exhibit #2 on current field) and forward this approved action to the Adams Village Board for their consideration. Vote For: Ideus, Dorn, Parde, Finkner, Remmers, and Meints. Vote Against: None. Motion carried.

Vote For: Parde, Finkner, Remmers, Ideus, and Dorn. Vote Against: Meints. Motion carried.

Motion by Finkner and second by Meints to approve Second Reading of the Policies in the 300's as revised. Vote For: Remmers, Meints, Ideus, Dorn, Parde, and Finkner. Vote Against: None. Motion carried.

Additional discussion items included: Classified negotiations, staff fall welcome back, budget information, pre-school grant, NSAA, future track options, and the June 22<sup>nd</sup> workshop.
