

MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION

FREEMAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The school is not permitted to provide any medications for students except in the case of breathing emergencies or anaphylaxis. If you would like your child to have access to medications, you will need to provide the school with the supply to be dispensed as directed. **The medication must be sent to school in the original container with an intact, clearly legible label.**

Elementary students must turn in their medication to their classroom teacher who will dispense the medication. Secondary students must turn in their medication to the office and report to the office for the medication to be dispensed.

A student may carry prescription emergency medications with a parent/guardian's written permission and that of your physician. Emergency medications include, but are not limited to, an asthma inhaler, diabetic supplies and an epinephrine pen. **A student who self administers an emergency medication must report to a school staff member for appropriate follow-up care.**

This authorization form must be completed by the student's legal guardian and received by the school before any medication (prescription or over the counter) can be administered. A separate form must be submitted for each medication. Extra forms are available at either office or for downloading from the school website.
